**Re: Mayor's Facilities Fund: London Borough of Greenwich BMX track at Hornfair Park**

Access Sport is a charity which works to improve access to sport for young people living in disadvantaged areas by developing community sports clubs across a range of sports.

As part of our overall project to develop 50 New Model community clubs in East London Access Sport is leading a delivery partnership which includes British Cycling, the 5 individual Olympic Boroughs (including Greenwich), the 5 Host Borough Strategic Regeneration Framework ["SRF"] Group, ProActive East London and Lee Valley Regional Park Authority to realise the SRF objectives of building 5 new BMX tracks and creating 5 new BMX clubs in those boroughs.

Access Sport's partnership based application to the Mayor's Participation Fund (Community Inclusion theme) to build the 5 clubs has been successful (announced on 6<sup>th</sup> December 2010). BMX tracks in Newham, Waltham Forest and Hackney are now in the advanced stages of planning and will be built by April this year.

This application represents an important element of the overall project scheme and the partnership we represent wholeheartedly supports it for the following reasons:

1. The Greenwich team, led by Paul Martindill, have been thorough, professional and partnership oriented in planning and pulling together key local agencies.
2. The Borough is demonstrating its commitment to success by putting considerable match money behind both the build of the track and accompanying facilities and the development of the new club.
3. The plans are centred on an excellent multisport hub site which fits exactly with Sport England's longterm drive for multisport sites.
4. The track build is accompanied by clear plans which have the necessary financial and partnership backing to deliver a thriving, community focused BMX club on the site which will ensure usage and sustainability.

5. BMX is a growth sport and the track and similar projects set in similar demographics demonstrate that the track will achieve impressive engagement for local people as well as attracting users from across South East London.
6. The track is to be set in an area of high multiple deprivation and will be used as a springboard to engage harder to reach groups through the new club in partnership with youth agencies, including Youth Services, Safer Neighbourhood Teams, and local schools.
7. Clear plans and partnership strategies have been put in place to ensure:
  - a. that the Mayor's health agenda for attracting previously inactive people (the Sport England definition) is fully addressed
  - b. that usage is inclusive for those with disabilities in accordance with Inclusive and Active 2 [in partnership with Interactive]
8. No serviceable BMX tracks exist in South East London. There are distance and transport issues for Greenwich residents in getting to the new Olympic VeloPark BMX facility north of the river. The proposed track will service not only local people but also act as a hub for users across South East London.

Many thanks for the information about the exciting developments that will be taking place in Hornfair Park over the next couple of years.


The school is involved with the Olympic and Paralympics Legacy and our Olympic Champion and our Subject Leader for physical education are very much involved in this work.

**Re: BMX**

Thank you for your information regarding a potential BMX track at Hornfair Park. Over the past 10 years Lewisham has built three small skate parks in key areas of the Borough, which are also accessed by BMXers. However I do think that there would be interest and demand for a more dedicated site for BMXers, given the limitations in types of terrain and distance, of our own skateparks. We have run successful BMX events in local parks before and had a good turn out. In particular, young people from the north of our Borough would be likely to travel to a dedicated site which is not that far away and on reasonably direct travel routes.

As you know boarders and BMXers do travel frequently to other sites so I would see no problem in travel to Hornfair Park. If and when the track is developed please let me know and our parks officers can alert skatepark users across the borough to the facility launch initially.
